"Reaping the Sanctuarys Benefits #6 Pastor Stephen Bohr" was posted by Daily Hymns on YouTube on 2/10/20.

During the sermon about 29 Scripture references were posted. You can count them yourself; I could be off by one or two. What is interesting is that out of the 29 references quoted, all were from Bohr's favorite bible, the New King James Version (NKJV), except for one that was from the King James Version (KJV) at around 20:21. Why was that?

From the KJV – "Neither by the blood of goats and calves, but by his own blood he entered in once into the holy place, having obtained eternal redemption for us. Hebrews 9:12.

From the NKJV (which is not an improved KJV) – "Not with the blood of goats and calves, but with His own blood He entered the Most Holy Place once for all, having obtained eternal redemption."

So why did Stephen Bohr have to abandon his favorite bible? The above verse is not a prophecy. It records something that happened in the past. The KJV says Jesus entered the "holy place" while the NKJV says He entered the "Most Holy Place." If Jesus entered the Most Holy Place of the heavenly sanctuary right after His crucifixion, then the Seventh-day Adventist doctrine that Jesus didn't enter the Most Holy Place until October 22, 1844 is wrong and Ellen G. White was a false prophet.
