

Hope Through Prophecy on 12/7/19 posted “Baptism: 10 Bible Facts You MUST Know” – Dustin Pestlin” on YouTube.

The favored bible of the day was the New King James Version (NKJV) and around 7:41 Matthew 28:19-20 was quoted from it.

Matthew 28:19-20 from the King James Version (KJV) - "[19] Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: [20] Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen."

Matthew 28:19-20 from the NKJV - "[19] Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, [20] teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age.' Amen."

There are two significant differences between the two bibles. The KJV says "teach all nations" and the NKJV says "make disciples of all nations." The second significant difference is "end of the world" versus "end of the age." We'll take the second difference first.

According to those believing in the New Age doctrine, the world isn't going to end with the second coming of Christ, it's just eventually going to peter out as its Sun dies in millions of years. According to them, we're now in the age of Pices soon to enter the age of Aquarius or we could already be in the age of Aquarius. The NKJV supports New Age doctrine. In fact in other places where the KJV says "end of the world" it has been changed to "end of the age" in the NKJV.

Now for the "make" versus "teach" issue. The words have two different connotations. You don't think there's much of a difference? Well, there is a church that does. I have a Holy Trinity Edition of the Catholic Bible which is a modified Douay Challoner Rheims Bible. It has a picture of Pope Pius XII in it and, if I were a faithful Catholic, and read it for 15 minutes a day with great reverence, I would get an indulgence of three years. That bible also says to "make" disciples. Here is the footnote in that bible for Matthew 28:19-20:

"St. Matthew's last words are the climax of his Gospel; Christ sends forth His Apostles to conquer the world and make all men His disciples."

If you don't know what is meant by "make" disciples, I would recommend reading The Great Controversy or Foxe's Book of Martyrs.
