"Deliverance Ministry part 1 - Dr. Conrad Vine" was posted on YouTube on 4/21/23 by QVtv – WHERE ARE YOU GOING on 4/21/23. The subject was deliverance from the attacks of Satan by ridding our lives of sins that enables Satan to attack us. The subject of the sermon is very good but unfortunately, Conrad apparently doesn't know the real Bible from the fake one (the New Revised Standard Version) he mostly uses and picks up and reads from.

At 21:11 Conrad starts to discuss Jewish mystics using a scroll to come into the presence of God whilst tripping under the influence of "mind bending drugs like the Beatles taking LSD in India." He then says, at 21:55, "And Paul is talking here autobiographically. And he's saying that he was caught up into the third heaven and he received revelations that he's not permitted to speak about. That means God has given Paul unique revelations about who God is and about the plan of salvation." "Autobiographically" means one is writing about one's own experience. Conrad is apparently saying that Paul took "mind bending drugs" and while under their influence he received "unique revelations about who God is and about the plan of salvation." Druggies would like to know this. I really hope that this was a misspeak and that Conrad didn't really mean what he said.

At 22:13 Conrad posts 2 Corinthians 12:7 from the New Revised Standard Version (NRSV) but when reading it changes it slightly. Instead of the word "elated" he substitutes "proud." Conrad apparently feels qualified to edit what he calls the Word of God if he thinks it should be worded a little differently.

In speaking of the "thorn" that was given Paul "in the flesh." Conrad says "some people say he had bad eyesight." Conrad also says, "We also know that Paul was not a good public speaker. The church of Corinth says so." Here is what the is recorded in the real Word of God about that.

"That I may not seem as if I would terrify you by letters. For *his* letters, say they, *are* weighty and powerful; but *his* bodily presence *is* weak, and *his* speech contemptible. Let such an one think this, that, such as we are in word by letters when we are absent, such *will* we be also in deed when we are present." 2 Corinthians 10:9-11 from the King James Version (KJV).

It does NOT say Paul wasn't a good public speaker. It merely says some people said he wasn't good at speaking. It also clearly says that as "we" (which would include Paul) were "in word by letter" when absent would also be "in deed when we are present." Conrad should give more attention to reading English. There is more Conrad should read.

Here's what someone says about Paul's eyesight and about his speaking ability.

"He was ever to carry about with him in the body the marks of Christ's glory, in his eyes, which had been blinded by the heavenly light, and he desired also to bear with him constantly the assurance of Christ's sustaining grace." *Spirit of Prophecy* volume 3 page 319.

"The stoics and the Epicureans encountered him; but they, and all others who came in contact with him, soon saw that he had a store of knowledge even greater than their own. His intellectual power commanded the respect and attention of the more intellectual and

learned; while his earnest logical reasoning, and his power of oratory, held the promiscuous audience." *Sketches From the Life of Paul* page 92.

"The people were carried away with admiration of Paul's eloquence." *Sketches From the Life of Paul* page 95.

At 25:43 Conrad posts a verse as follows. The quotation marks are his as he quoted it.

"And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil" Matt. 6.13.

Here is that passage from some different bibles.

"And do not bring us to the time of trial, but rescue us from the evil one." Matthew 6:13 from the NRSV.

"And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil." Matthew 6:13 from the English Standard Version (ESV).

"And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil: For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever. Amen." Matthew 6:13 from the KJV.

Did Conrad quote from the ESV or from the KJV? I guess we don't know.

At 37:52 Conrad says, "And, uh, if you are infantry, and you are commanded to stand, that means that essentially, you are in a defensive posture. He says in Ephesians six verse thirteen, Therefore take up the whole armor of God, so that you may be able to stand on that evil day, that is, evil will come knocking at your door, whether you like it or not, whether you want it or not, whether you deserve it or not, whether it's justified or not, evil will come knocking at my door, and at your door. So are you going to stand? And the only way to stand when evil comes knocking at your door, is to put on the whole armor of God. And you're not to go looking for trouble, you're sup, you're to stand with the shield of faith, and the breastplates of righteousness, and the helmets of salvation, girded about with a belt of truth, 'cause truth holds everything together, and on your feet you, you have the readiness to share the gospel, you're an active witness for Jesus, and the only offensive armor that you have is the sword of the Spirit."

The real Bible defines the "sword of the Spirit."

"And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God." Ephesians 6:17 from the KJV.

It's best to not take a fake sword into battle.

At 40:16 Conrad picks up his favorite fake sword and says, "But, ah, then we say that this, printed, Bible, this is also the Word of God, and in English we don't distinguish between *logos* or any other kind of word, we say this is the Word of God, preaching is the act of proclaiming, the living lo, living word, by the spoken word, from the written word."

At 41:28 Conrad says, "And the question arises, can you get anything a hundred percent true out of someone who is a hundred percent sinful? No you can't. Even if you are ninety-nine percent true, and one percent, ah, false, ah, you cannot speak a hundred percent truth out of that which inherently flawed." I agree with that.

At 41:59 Conrad says, "The only words I know that you know, that any of us has access to that are absolutely true are found in the Word of God because God inspired them and God is true. And God is, He does not lie. In Him is no shadow or darkness. And so the only words that you and I know are absolutely true are the Word of God." As he says this he picks up his fake bible. Does Conrad not know that his fake "Word of God" is not "absolutely true?" If he doesn't know that, it's very sad. If he does know that and says the "Word of God" he holds in his hand is "absolutely true" he is a liar.

At 43:14 Conrad says, "And so, um, when we encounter people who are experiencing demonization the antidote to the lies of Satan is the truth of the Word of God. And so we respond to the attacks of Satan by quoting Scripture. And ah, so for instance in my Bible here, ah, maybe you cannot see it, but I have a list of texts here that I include that, ah, these are texts that deal with the authority of Jesus over demons. The fact that Satan is one day gonna be destroyed, that his fate is certain, that the demons tremble because they know their fate, the dembles, the devils tremble because the know there, uh, is one God."

Actually, Conrad's fake Word of God says Satan has already been destroyed.

"With an anointed cherub as guardian I placed you; you were on the holy mountain of God; you walked among the stones of fire. You were blameless in your ways from the day that you were created, until iniquity was found in you. By the multitude of your iniquities, in the unrighteousness of your trade, you profaned your sanctuaries. So I brought out fire from within you; it consumed you, and I turned you to ashes on the earth in the sight of all who saw you." Ezekiel 28:14-15, 18 from the NRSV.

Even though the NRSV is very confused because it says "With an anointed cherub," any Seventh-day Adventist minister will tell you that this passage is about Lucifer who became known as Satan. Conrad's favorite fake bible says Satan has been "consumed" (past tense) and "turned to ashes" (past tense) so Conrad's alleged Word of God that's supposedly "absolutely true" tells us that Satan is dead.

Some special people at Andrews University would tell you about the Hebrew "prophetic perfect" by which God indicates something will really happen by phrasing it in past tense. If that is true, then any prophecy about a future event written in Hebrew would have to be written in past tense or it would mean God wasn't entirely sure it would happen.

Here is what the real Bible says.

"Thou art the anointed cherub that covereth; and I have set thee so: thou wast upon the holy mountain of God; thou hast walked up and down in the midst of the stones of fire. Thou

wast perfect in thy ways from the day that thou wast created, till iniquity was found in thee. Thou hast defiled thy sanctuaries by the multitude of thine iniquities, by the iniquity of thy traffick; therefore will I bring forth a fire from the midst of thee, it shall devour thee, and I will bring thee to ashes upon the earth in the sight of all them that behold thee." Ezekiel 28:14-15, 18 from the KJV.

At 48:30 Conrad mentions "Lucifer," a name that occurs nowhere in his favorite fake bible, and references Isaiah 14:12. Here is that verse from Conrad's favorite fake bible and then from the real Bible.

"How you are fallen from heaven, O Day Star, son of Dawn! How you are cut down to the ground, you who laid the nations low!" Isaiah 14:12 from the NRSV.

"How art thou fallen from heaven, O Lucifer, son of the morning! how art thou cut down to the ground, which didst weaken the nations!" Isaiah 14:12 from the KJV.

The "Day Star" is the star we see every morning and throughout the day when no clouds obscure it. It's the Sun. The Sun can also be called the "morning star."

"It is I, Jesus, who sent my angel to you with this testimony for the churches. I am the root and the descendant of David, the bright morning star." Revelation 22:16 from the NRSV.

I hope I don't need to explain that for you.

And wouldn't you know it. I'm not surprised because Seventh-day Adventist ministers commonly mention it even when using a fake bible. Conrad doesn't quote it but he mentions it at 48:37. It's part of the passage quoted above (Ezekiel 28:15) that says Satan is already dead in Conrad's favorite fake bible.

At 50:38 Conrad mentions "heavenly realms" which is a phrase that occurs in the New International Version (NIV) and not in the NRSV in Ephesians 6:12.

There are many more lies in the NRSV. Maybe Conrad knows that... Or, maybe he doesn't...
