"Modern Babylon Identified! (LIVE STREAM)" was posted by White Horse Media on YouTube on 5/9/20 with Steve Wohlberg and Tim Saxon presiding.

I notice that you're using the King James Version Easy Read (KJVER) bible. That is one of the more deceptive ones. Here are some of the problems with it.

- 1. I don't think there is any exhaustive concordance for it; at least I found none advertised on eBay or Amazon. That makes it harder to look up verses when you've forgotten exactly where they are.
- 2. The title itself is deceptive. The big push with modern bible versions is to convince people that the Word of God is too hard to understand. The "Easy Read" part in the title of this bible contributes to that myth.
- 3. It is replete with underlined words with alternate meanings. This implies the Bible is defective and you can't be sure what God said. It prepares people to accept bibles like the New King James Version that are worse. In addition, I consider all the underlined words distracting. If, for my personal use, I wish to underline or highlight something to help me remember a concept, I wish to do that myself and not have it done for me.
- 4. Committing Scripture to memory is a defense against Satan. The army of the Lord should be using one Bible in order to be united. Few people use or are going to use the KJVER. It is NO improvement over the King James Version.
- 5. There are places where the suggested alternate word destroys the use of a verse to teach Seventh-day Adventist doctrine. A favorite verse to show that "soul" means a person and not a separate entity that departs a person at death is Genesis 2:7. The suggested word to replace "soul" is "being." If "being" is used in that verse it can no longer be used to show that "soul" means a person. In Isaiah 14:12 a suggested meaning of "Lucifer" is "king of Babylon and/or Satan." No, in Isaiah 14:12 "Lucifer" IS Satan and not maybe the "king of Babylon."
- 6. Suggested word meanings attack the divinity of Jesus Christ. Many new bibles have substituted "Joshua" for "Jesus" in Hebrews 4:8 even though the same Greek word is translated "Jesus" thirteen other times just in the book of Hebrews. This obscures a link to Psalms 95 which shows that Jesus is God and is the One who led the children of Israel. This panders to those who teach that Jesus was a created being; i.e., a little less than the eternal God. The KJVER has "Jesus" in that verse but it's underlined and the suggested alternate word is "Joshua."
- 7. The makers of the KJVER apparently think the Bible needs to be dumbed down for the current modern generation that knows how to surf the internet, can use a telephone, etc. Tell me, do you need to be told that Holy "Ghost" is the same as Holy "Spirit?" Have we become so dumb that we don't know that "fowls" means "birds?"

The KJVER is a gateway bible; kind of like marijuana and alcohol that are gateway drugs to the harder stuff.
