

“Ancient Prophecy CONFIRMS the Bible! [DANIEL 2]” was posted on YouTube by Hope Through Prophecy on 4/11/20.

On the day of the publication of this video, Dustin Pestlin had 206,000 subscribers to his channel. He even has a shirt with a winged lion under which is the title of his channel, Hope Through Prophecy. The discussion is on Daniel chapter 2. In this video Dustin used the New King James Version (NKJV) consistently.

At 1:50 Dustin says the king couldn't remember the dream and at 2:48 puts up Daniel 2:5 from the NKJV.

“The king answered and said to the Chaldeans, ‘My decision is firm: if you do not make known the dream to me, and its interpretation, you shall be cut in pieces, and your houses shall be made an ash heap.’ Daniel 2:5 from the NKJV.

“The king answered and said to the Chaldeans, The thing is gone from me: if ye will not make known unto me the dream, with the interpretation thereof, ye shall be cut in pieces, and your houses shall be made a dunghill.” Daniel 2:5 from the King James Version (KJV).

The king forgetting the details of his dream and Daniel telling him the details of his dream and the interpretation is a key part of the story in Daniel 2. The Seventh-day Adventist *Sabbath School Bible Study Guide* for the first quarter of 2020 was on Daniel and the forgetting of the dream is mentioned in the lesson on Daniel 2. I've never heard a Seventh-day Adventist sermon preached on Daniel 2 where this wasn't emphasized. Dustin talks about what “the Bible says” when he apparently doesn't know what his bible of choice says.

If you have a NKJV bible, I encourage you to read the entirety of Daniel 2. You will find not one place where it says the king forgot what his dream was. It says he demanded to know what the interpretation was without telling the Chaldeans what the dream was but nowhere does it say he had forgotten the dream. You can also look up this verse in the Revised Standard Version, the New Revised Standard Version, the New International Version, the English Standard Version and the Christian Standard Bible and none of them say the king had forgotten his dream. The only one of these bibles that says the king had forgotten the dream or that “the thing is gone from me” is the KJV.
