A YouTube video titled "A Challenge to SDA Trinitarians" was posted on the OTG Remnant channel on 11/3/25. In it Wayne Kostolni attempts to show from the Bible and writings of Ellen G. White that the doctrine of the trinity is false. He started this YouTube channel this year and many of the videos he posted are about the trinity. You can watch this video at:

Wayne refers to brothers and sisters in the church so I presume that he claims to be a Seventh-day Adventist. Wayne says that he'll make his point with three Spirit of Prophecy quotations and three Bible verses.

While praying at 0:34 Wayne expresses the hope that his video will "cause some searching of the Scriptures and the writings of Ellen White to determine what is the truth."

Wayne says he knows there will be some people outside of the Seventh-day Adventist Church who will leave "nasty comments" and says he's "OK with that" so I left the following comment.

"There are three living persons of the heavenly trio; in the name of these three great powers—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit—those who accept Christ by living faith are baptized, and these powers will cooperate with the obedient subjects of heaven in their efforts to live the new life in Christ." *Ellen G. White Special Testimonies Series A and B* (reprint with ISBN 9781495468902) page 202. Also found in *Evangelism* page 615.

"He was equal with God, infinite and omnipotent...He is the eternal, self-existent Son." *Evangelism* page 615 and Manuscript 101, 1897.

"[7] For there are three that bear record in heaven, the Father, the Word, and the Holy Ghost: and these three are one. [8] And there are three that bear witness in earth, the Spirit, and the water, and the blood: and these three agree in one." 1 John 5:7-8.

There is a book titled *Communication with the Spirit World* by Johannes Greber. In it are quotations of things said by a demon speaking through a medium. Here is one of those quotations found on page 369.

"The doctrine that three persons are united in one Godhead finds its main support in the grossly falsified passage in the Epistle of John, the correct version of which reads: 'For there are three that bear witness, the Spirit, the water, and the blood: and the three of them are in accord'. (*Ist John 5:8.*) To this has been added the spurious sentence: 'And there are three who bear witness in Heaven, the Father, the Word, and the Spirit, and these three are one'. That this entire last sentence is a spurious interpolation is a fact of which your Catholic theologians are well aware."

Do you think the demon was being helpful by pointing out a doctrinal error in the Bible?

"Now the Spirit speaketh expressly, that in the latter times some shall depart from the faith, giving heed to seducing spirits, and doctrines of devils." 1 Timothy 4:1.

Furthermore, any bible that doesn't have the entirety of 1 John 5:7 is a bible that will have other errors.

Apparently, the comment exceeded Wayne's limit of nastiness so when I checked later, my comment wasn't there.

Here's the first passage Wayne posted.

"Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God: But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men: And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross. Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name:" Philippians 2:6-9 from the King James Version (KJV).

Wayne says it means "He didn't count equality with God a thing to be grasped." That is NOT what the KJV says even though Wayne wants it to. The real Bible says Jesus thought "it not robbery to be equal with God." That means since He WAS God it wasn't robbery to be EQUAL with God.

Here's a "the Bible" that words it like Wayne wishes it to be worded.

"who, as He already existed in the form of God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped," Philippians 2:6 from the New American Standard Bible (NASB).

Wayne then posts a quotation from Ellen G. White's writings.

"Before the entrance of evil there was peace and joy throughout the universe. All was in perfect harmony with the Creator's will. Love for God was supreme, love for one another impartial. Christ the Word, the Only Begotten of God was one with the eternal Father—one in nature, in character, and in purpose,—the only being in all the universe that could enter into all the counsels and purposes of God." *The Great Controversy* page 493.

Following this Wayne said, "Now, in The Great Controversy, I'm gonna read three quotations from Ellen White here and I'm gonna challenge my SDA Trinitarian brothers and sisters to leave me some comments about what do these statements really mean." Yeah, he really said that and he deleted my comment.

Wayne thinks Sister White's use of the term "Only Begotten of God" is important and that only one being could enter into all of God's counsels.

Wayne posted another Spirit of Prophecy quotation.

"The great Creator assembled the heavenly host, that he might in the presence of all the angels confer special honor upon his Son. The Son was seated on the throne with the Father, and the heavenly throng of holy angels was gathered around them. The Father then made known that it was ordained by himself that Christ, his Son, should be equal with himself; so that wherever was the presence of his Son, it was as his own presence." *Spirit of Prophecy* volume 1 page 17.

Wayne says that this happened "before Lucifer began his rebellion." In the sentence right before the above quotation it says, "Satan was envious of Christ, and gradually assumed command which devolved on Christ alone." The heavenly host was assembled because Lucifer had already started his rebellion.

Wayne wants to know "why does Ellen White here say that it was ordained by himself that Christ, his Son, should be equal with himself?" He then says, "If you are a Trinitarian in the SDA Church explain this statement in a comment. Let me know what this means because I understand this to mean that there were not three eternal coequal beings because number one the Son was the only one who could enter into the counsels and purposes of God, and number two, the Father Himself ordained the Son should be equal with Himself. That's not Trinitarian."

We've already seen how leaving a comment works. If the comment is too threatening to his Antitrinitarian religion, Wayne removes it. Furthermore, Sister White did not say "the Son was the only one who could enter into the counsels and purposes of God." She said He was the only one "that could enter into all the counsels and purposes of God." Wayne left out the "all."

I do not claim to know all there is to know about the Godhead and I'm confident that neither I nor anyone else will ever know all there is to know about it. For reasons I don't understand, Jesus Christ was the only One who could be the sacrifice for the sins of the human race and in that respect, His position is a very unique one. YOU DO NOT use your feeble mind to misquote inspired statements in a way that clearly contradicts other statements by inspired authors. If you read the comment I posted that Wayne deleted, it should be CRYSTAL CLEAR that the Father, the Word, and the Holy Ghost "are one." Count them if you need to. ONE, TWO, THREE! That is a TRINITY. Put off thy shoes from off thy feet, for the place whereon thou standest is holy ground.

Wayne posts another Ellen G. White quotation.

"God is the Father of Christ; Christ is the Son of God. To Christ has been given an exalted position. He has been made equal with the Father. All the counsels of God are opened to His Son." *Counsels For The Church* page 76.

Once again Wayne says he'd like to know the thoughts of Trinitarians in the S.D.A. Church. Yeah, right.

Wayne said that "according to Philippians two He was made equal with the Father" when he reascended up into heaven. Philippians 2 was not posted at this place in his talk and there was the


sudden posting of another passage. Wayne previously posted a passage from Philippians 2 from the KJV and then misquoted it like it would appear in some "the Bible" like the NASB.

"And now, O Father, glorify thou me with thine own self with the glory which I had with thee before the world was." John 17:5 (KJV).

At 5:48 Wayne posts, "Challenge to SDA Trinitarians – Why Did Ellen White Make These Statements? Leave Some Comments"

In his closing prayer, Wayne claims that the S.D.A. Church no longer teaches what it used to teach. I'll admit that the S.D.A. Church is in a poor condition right now but the doctrine of the Trinity is not one of its problems.
